12 councilors will set policy. The mayor will manage city operations with a city administrator.



Roles of the Council and the Mayor



- Approves the City budget in accordance with the strategic plan.
- Approves policies* necessary to respond to community or organizational issues and to achieve strategic outcomes.
- Proposes budget funding necessary to implement the strategic plan.
- Requests development of policies* to address community or operational issues or to achieve strategic outcomes.
