- October 15, 2018 Introduction and overview of Civic Life and role of advisory bodies.
- November 19, 2018 Public officials training; overview of short and long term goals; budget process and timelines; questions regarding metrics and evaluation of outcomes -not fully developed.
- December 17, 2018 Small groups meeting with coordinators explaining each program with Q&A.
- January 7, 2019 Discussed program updates and proposed changes with equity impact and in consideration of 1% required budget cut.
