BYLAWS:

- BAC is an advisory body that advises the Director of Civic Life, not City Council.
- The BAC meetings are public and are subject to state public meeting laws:
 - No meetings without publishing meeting agendas
 - o No communication about business of this committee on personal devises/accounts.
- The City's Tribal Relations Director is the point person for ALL Tribal relations and engagement.
- No quorum requirement for BAC, since it is not a voting body.

Mayor's 2020 Budget Priorities and Guidelines:

Mayor Budget Guidelines

- Review of document and discussion: Michael Montoya lead
 - o Discussion about the 2% cut for Public Safety from Mayor's guidelines and the collaborative inner-bureau approach to public safety.
 - o Question to BAC: What is BAC's role in #4 of Mayor Wheeler's priorities:
 - Priority Issue Area 4: Leadership Action on Climate Change We are facing a climate crisis. Scientists have issued a warning that avoiding catastrophic impacts of climate change will require an unprecedented transformation over the next decade. All the while we are seeing Portland's emission reductions start to plateau. Portland will continue to act as a national and global leader on the issue of climate change, and all City bureaus will have a critical role to play.
 - o Conversation RE: new BOC "Add Requests" process
 - General Fund Add Requests: The reprieve from budget cut proposals provides less flexibility to consider new add requests. Bureaus may submit requests for new General Fund discretionary resources; however, all new funding requests should be paired with a proposal to offset at least 50% of the proposed cost with an efficiency or reduction package proposed individually or in partnership with other bureaus. Requests for new resources should demonstrate meaningful progress towards achieving approved Council and bureau strategic plans.

 Question RE: Cannabis revenue allocation process. It is a council decision. Conversation about where it is currently allocated and a note that there is a work session scheduled for early spring.
