WHERETOGETHER advancing solutions for homelessness

The homeless crisis in the Portland metro region demands our attention.

Thousands of our neighbors – veterans, seniors, women and children escaping domestic violence, and people with chronic illnesses – are living everyday without a safe, stable place to sleep at night. Many are experiencing homelessness for the first time.

We cannot ignore what is happening all around us. Homelessness is not a choice. As our region's booming economy and quality of life continues to grow, so has our population and the cost of housing. As a result, thousands of families are living on the brink of homelessness because their rent is far outpacing their income.

It's time to unite for a real solution.

We can't wait any longer for federal or state governments to solve homelessness in the Portland metro region. When longtime residents, aging seniors, and essential service workers like teachers and nursing aides can't afford to live here, we risk losing what makes our region so special. Oregon ranks #1 in the nation for unsheltered families with children.

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- **56,000+ households** are at risk of homelessness in the Portland metro region due to rising housing costs
- Clackamas County experienced a 35% rise in homeless children from 2015-2017
- Washington County experienced a 25% jump in homelessness among those with mental health challenges in one year
- 8,000 students in Portland metro region schools experienced homelessness in 2017



HereTogether is forging a new path.

HereTogether is a coalition of service providers, business leaders, elected officials, philanthropists, and advocates who believe homelessness in the Portland Metro region is a solvable problem. By uniting community leaders and experts, we are building a region-wide response to homelessness that targets the roots of the problem with solutions that can match the scale and scope of the crisis.

There are proven strategies and best practices that help people and families impacted by homelessness transition to stable living. Successful programs increase access to affordable homes, prevent seniors living on Social Security from falling through the cracks, increase income for homeless adults, and connect people with wrap-around services that help them get back on their feet. We are engaging the community to better align our efforts, maximize our impact, and elevate full-scale solutions throughout the greater Portland metro region.
