Here Together Initiative

Penkin and Dickson share information about the Here Together initiative, intended to be a ballot measure in November. Here Together proposes the creation of a continuous stream of funding for services related to homelessness. Penkin hopes neighborhoods and coalitions will support the initiative.

Penkin and Dickson will ask a Here Together representative to speak at the NWNW February meeting.

Adopt One Block

Penkin shares information about a phone app that connects volunteers with clean up supplies, to make cleaning neighborhoods easier. A representative will speak at the NWNW February meeting.

Neighborhood Reports

Northwest Heights: Reaching out to adjacent neighborhoods.

Hillside: Approving I-45 committee recommendations at upcoming meeting, Lincoln Soccer Club likely taking over Hillside Center.

Pearl: Upcoming visioning session, last phase of trash can program, clean team reached 80 volunteers, foot patrol reached 50 volunteers, installing cigarette receptacles on traffic poles.

Goose Hollow: Biggest challenge in cleaning neighborhood streets is biohazards and getting trash picked up, land use focused on Block 7 multi-dwelling unit.

Downtown: Clean teams twice per month with 12 volunteers, active land use committee, Dickson shared details about successful homelessness forum—now working on extensive follow up.

Linnton: Trying to save Columbia pool—asks neighborhoods to send their own letters of support. Linnton Community Center having safety issues, implemented cameras and panic buttons, car drove through the center in December.

NWDA: Land Use Chair John Bradley passed away.
